The papers of William Goldman were deposited with the Labor History Archives in April, 1968 by William Goldman.

William Goldman was born October 10, 1906 in Yale, Kansas and was educated at Dawson High School in New Mexico. He was a member of UAW Local 230 (Chrysler/Los Angeles) where he served as a member of the shop bargaining committee and as President. In 1946 Mr. Goldman joined the staff of the UAW as an International Representative to Region 6.
