The papers of Nicholas Hyshka were deposited with the Labor History Archives in July 19 6 8 by Miss Dorian Hyshka.

Nicholas Hyshka began his labor career by joining the Western Federation of Miners in 1913. He later became employed in the auto industry. Hyshka's work with the UAW included serving as Director of Education for Local 544 and he later served in the same post for Local 80. Until his death in 1968, Hyshka remained active in the retiree program of the UAW.

The Nicholas Hyshka Collection covers the period from 1944 to 1966.
