The papers of Jana Pellusch were placed in the Archives of Labor and Urban Affairs in June of 1976 by Ms. Pellusch and were opened for research in December of 1985.

Jana Pellusch was a delegate to the second national convention of the Coalition of Labor Union Women (CLUW) held in Detroit in December, 1975, attended by some 1000 women from sixty unions registered as voting delegates. The stated objectives of CLUW were "to unify all union women in a viable organization to determine our complex problems and concerns and to develop action problems within the framework of our unions to deal effectively with our objectives."

The papers of Ms. Pellusch consist of several pages of her personal comments on the convention plus several newspaper clippings from $\underline{\text{The Militant}}$ relating to the convention.
