The papers of Max Weinrib were placed in the Archives of Labor and Urban Affairs in February of 1980 by Carl Shier, International Representative of Region 4 of the United Automobile Workers, and were opened for research in January of 1989.

Max Weinrib was a union member active in Local 719 in the early 40's. He later served as a member of the Ad Hoc Committee for Marion Ciepley and Irwin Rappaport, two members who were expelled from Lodge 113, International Association for Machinists, (IAM) Chicago, Illinois in 1958.

The papers of Mr. Weinrib consist of correspondence, news releases and pamphlets relating primarily to the factional quarrel in the Tool and Die Makers Lodge 113, IAM and the expulsion of two members, Marion Ciepley and Irwin Rappaport. The correspondence is chiefly among the advocates for "union democracy seeking ways and means to assist Ciepley and Rappaport in their battle with IAM officials. As regards the role of the reform movement in the administration of Lodge 113 and their reinstatement in the union.
