The papers of Bill Goode were placed in the Archives of Labor and Urban Affairs in February of 1984 by Mr. Goode and were opened for research in September of 1984.

Bill Goode received A.B. and M.A. degrees from Wayne State University and a doctorate in education from Rutgers University.

He served as Director of Education, with the UAW and was Director of the Family Education Center of the UAW at Black Lake, Michigan. He subsequently became Associate Professor of Sociology at Empire State College, SUNY, Saratoga Springs, New York.

The papers of Mr. Goode consist primarily of copies of declassified documents from the files of the Federal Bureau of Investigation relating to alleged Communist affiliations of Nat Ganley and Walter Reuther. The declassified F.B.I. files also contain documents relating to the Association of Catholic Trade Unionists. The papers also include some declassified documents from the files of the Military Intelligence Division (G.2) of the U.S. War Department relating to Walter Reuther. The files are arranged alphabetically by subject.
