#### **Transfers**

Several documents and a New York Times obituary of Benjamin K. Tucker have been placed in the biography vertical file in the Reuther Archives Library. Benjamin Tucker was a proponent of philosophical anarchism, from 1881 to 1908. He later maintained a bookstore in New York City that specialized in the works of anarchist, atheists, and Free Thinkers. The store was a center for many liberals and radicals of the day.
