The papers of Barry H. Roderick were placed in the Archives of Labor and Urban Affairs in July of 1987 and in December of 1989 by Mr. Roderick and were opened for research in December of 1991.

Barry Roderick, collection and historian, established a manuscript collection of historical materials pertaining to left political, labor, and social movements in Alaska and the North - Northwest in the Alaska Historical Society in Juneau, Alaska.

The papers of Mr. Roderick consist of a few flyers announcing events sponsored by the Juneau - Douglas Industrial Workers of the World and the Juneau Third World Perspective.

Non - Manuscript Material

Several documents and a $\underline{\text{New York Times}}$ obituary noted of a Mr. Benjamin K. Tucker have been placed in the biography vertical file in the Archives Library. Benjamin Tucker, a philosophical anarchism, from 1881 to 1908. He later maintained a bookstore in New York City which specialized in the works of anarchist, atheists, and Free Thinkers. The store was a center for liberals and many radicals of the day.
