The papers of the UAW Veterans' Department were deposited with the Labor History Archives in November of 1967 by the UAW and were opened for research in 1968.

The UAW Veterans' Department was created in 1944 as a part of the War Policy Division. Joseph Velosky was the director from 1944 to 1946. Other members of the Department included Frank Amico, George Buckley, William Marshall, and Forrest Woods. In 1946, the Veterans' Department was separated from the War Policy Division and became a separate department.

Some of the problems with which the Department was concerned were veterans' seniority, reemployment, the creation of regional and local veterans' committees, and state legislation for veterans.

The UAW Veterans' Department Collection covers the period from 1943 to 1947, with the major portion of the material covering the years from 1945 to 1946.
