We believe that God is giving us this chance to stand together and let this city know that we are weary of racism, tired of our people not having real justice, and now determined to stand side by side until justice and jobs are secured for everybody.

We hope that you will push these matters hard. On Monday evening at the mass meeting at Clayborne Temple, we hope to have continuing announcements for you.

We trust that Sunday, February 25, 1968 will prove a great day of the spirit of love and power for you and your people.
