Mr. Simon Alpert donated his papers to the Archives of Labor and Urban Affairs in April of 1982. The collection was opened for research in April of 1993.

Simon Alpert was born in Peabody, Massachusetts on April 4, 1920. He received his B.A. in journalism at City College of New York in 1941, where he had served as editor of the campus student newspaper. He subsequently worked as a journalist at the Washington D.C. Daily News, the Owosso, Michigan <u>Angus Press</u> and the <u>Toledo Blade</u>. From 1967 to 1982, he worked for the UAW as a journalist for <u>Solidarity</u> and the Public Relations Department. During this period, Mr. Alpert served as chairman of the UAW unit of the Detroit Newspaper Guild and was active in the OPEIU. He edited the UAW Credit Union quarterly newsletter <u>Dough Notes</u>, prepared several UAW pamphlets and frequently wrote articles for Solidarity.

The collection consists of Mr. Alpert's reference subject files used mainly for writing articles and preparing press releases.
