The papers of SEIU President David Sullivan were placed in the Archives of Labor and Urban Affairs in 1993 and 1994 by the Service Employees International Union and were opened for research in June of 1998.

Born in 1904, David Sullivan immigrated from Ireland to New York City in 1925. There, he became an elevator operator and later a founding member of the Service Employees International Union's Local 32B in 1934. Rapidly ascending the ranks of the local's leadership, Sullivan assumed its presidency in 1941 and became an international vice president in 1950 before attaining the rank of International President 10 years later.

Sullivan enhanced the union's visibility and influence by moving the International headquarters from Chicago to Washington, D.C. in 1963. In this same vein, he involved the union in the AFL-CIO's Committee on Political Education, a political fund designed to help finance the campaigns of politicians friendly to organized labor. He also became a vice president of the AFL-CIO, instituted a pension plan as well as a college scholarship program for members and their children, and directed the union's attention to the elderly and retired members. It was during his administration that the union dropped the word, "Building" from its name signifying SEIU's evolving mission. Thereafter, it would be known as the Service Employees International Union.

The Sullivan administration supported the social action philosophy of President John F. Kennedy's administration by developing a Civil Rights Department for SEIU and involved the union in President Lyndon B. Johnson's "Great Society" programs. Sullivan himself chaired the Office of Economic Opportunity's Labor Advisory Committee in the War on Poverty program. Sullivan's presidency received credit for its progressive tenor largely due to the motivation of Thomas Donahue, Sullivan's Executive Assistant, who served in that capacity until 1967 when he left SEIU to become Assistant Secretary of Labor.

SEIU's growing involvement in the organization of public employees under Sullivan's leadership coincided with the enactment of legislation at all levels of government and the

* In 1968, the International dropped the word, "Building" from its name. The name change reflected a changing membership, which included service employees not associated with buildings. However, some local affiliates would retain the word "Building" in their names.

issuance of executive orders by Presidents Kennedy and Nixon making it easier for public employee unions to organize and bargain collectively with the government. These political developments coupled with SEIU's organizing campaign, enabled the union to expand its membership from 275,000 to 430,000 during Sullivan's presidency. Many of these new members came from the ranks of public employees and health care workers.

This series is largely comprised of correspondence between SEIU locals and the International's Executive Office. It includes requests for strike sanctions, handwritten letters from rank and file members voicing various concerns, local union rosters, charter requests, approvals and revocations, grievances, orders from the Executive Office establishing or modifying union policy. Included as well are correspondence and other material regarding jurisdictional disputes, strike funds, contract negotiations, death gratuities, factional disputes, trusteeships, mergers and other issues. While all entries in the following folder level inventory for this series include local union names, check the "SEIU Charter Book" and the actual files for other names that locals were given, as local names occasionally changed. These records are arranged by local union number.

In 1961, William McFetridge, who had retained the presidency of Local 1 after leaving the International presidency, waged a bitter and damaging jurisdictional fight against Local 4, led by International Secretary-Treasurer, George Fairchild. Charges and counter charges of corruption, bribery, racism and raiding were alleged. The dispute received wide publicity as it progressed from the union's General Executive Board, through the state courts, even drawing the attention of two congressional committees. Shortly before the dispute ended in 1965, McFetridge attempted to regain the presidency of the International, but failed. During the same period, Sullivan terminated the union's interest in a Chicago real estate venture that McFetridge had initiated. These events concluded McFetridge's relationship with SEIU. The records within this series document the factional dispute between Locals 1 and 4 in the form of newspaper clippings, correspondence, union hearing transcripts, and various court records. Other important material regarding this dispute is located in the local union files of Locals 1 and 4, which are a part of Series I of this collection.
