Abstract:	The Society of Women Engineers (SWE) held the first International Conference of Women Engineers and Scientists (ICWES) June 15-21, 1964, to coincide with the SWE National Convention and the 1964 World's Fair in New York City, New York. Although ICWES planners originally estimated 300 participants, the conference brought together over 500 people from more than 35 countries to discuss the role of women engineers and the future of engineering. Following the success of the first ICWES (later referred to as ICWES I), women's science and engineering societies have hosted a total of 14 ICWES conferences in 11 countries.  The materials in these records document the origin and development of ICWES, as well as the technical and sociological subjects discussed at the conferences. Compiled from members of the Society of Women Engineers (SWE), these records document the planning and execution of the the first and seventh ICWES conferences (ICWES I and ICWES VII) held in 1964 and 1984, which were hosted by SWE. The records also document SWE's involvement with ICWES conferences hosted in other countries. Records include correspondence, reports, clippings, proceedings, and bound volumes.

## History

The Society of Women Engineers (SWE) was only 8 years old when its New York Section proposed hosting an international conference of women engineers concurrent with its national conference. Originally planned for 1963, the date of the first International Conference of Women Engineers and Scientists (ICWES) was changed to June 15-21, 1964, to coincide with the 1964 World's Fair in New York City, New York. To fund the conference, SWE received grants from the National Science Foundation, the Asia Foundation, the Engineers Joint Council, several companies, and donations from numerous SWE members. Although ICWES planners originally estimated 300 participants, the conference brought together over 500 people from more than 35 countries to discuss the role of women engineers and the future of engineering. The conference featured a trip to the New York World's Fair and a Parade of States and Roll Call of Nations for ICWES delegates, professional tours, technical presentations and papers, SWE meetings and awards banquets, and other events. Following the success of the first ICWES (later referred to as ICWES I), the Women's Engineering Society of Great Britain volunteered to host a second conference in 1967 in Cambridge, England. An International Continuing Committee with ten area representatives was formed to determine the location of each successive conference, which have generally been held triennially. Building on a resolution passed at the 1999 UNESCO World Science Conference to create a global network of women engineers and scientists, in 2001 the Canadian Commission for UNESCO organized a founding meeting for the International Network of Women Engineers and Scientists (INWES). A resolution was passed at ICWES XII in 2002 to transfer administrative functions from the International Continuing Committee to the INWES Board of Directors, and INWES is now responsible for the organization of ICWES conferences. The ICWES conferences held thus far have been: 1964 – New York City, United States (hosted by SWE) 1967 – Cambridge, England 1971 – Turin, Italy 1975 – Krakow, Poland 1978 – Rouen, France 1981 – Bombay, India 1984 - Washington, D.C., United States (hosted by SWE) 1987 - Abidjan, Ivory Coast 1991 -Warwick, England 1996 – Budapest, Hungary 1999 – Chiba, Japan 2002 – Ottawa, Canada 2005 – Seoul, Korea 2008 - Lille, France 2011 - Adelaide, Australia
