Abstract:	Isidore "Soby" Sobeloff (1894-1995) was the Director of the Jewish Welfare Federation of Detroit from 1937 to 1964. During his tenure, he made the Jewish philanthropic campaign in Detroit among the most effective in the United States. Sobeloff also served in other leadership roles in the Jewish community, including Secretary of the Allotment Committee of the United Jewish Appeal (1942), President of the National Conference of Jewish Social Welfare (1944), and member of the Jewish Center Division Executive Committee, National Jewish Welfare Board. From 1964 through 1969, Sobeloff served as the Director of the Jewish Federation Council of Greater Los Angeles. History

Isidore "Soby" Sobeloff was born on August 30, 1894, in Baltimore, Maryland. In his early career, Sobeloff worked as a reporter and later city editor. In 1922, Sobeloff enrolled in the Jewish Welfare Board Training School. Upon completion of the course, he became Executive Director of the Jewish Community Center in New Jersey.

In 1932, Sobeloff married Edith Mozorosky, and the Sobeloffs had one son, Jonathan.

From 1937 to 1964, Sobeloff was the Director of the Jewish Welfare Federation of Detroit. During his tenure, he made the Jewish philanthropic campaign in Detroit among the most effective in the United States. Prior to Sobeloff coming to Detroit, the Allied Jewish Campaign had raised \$350,690 from 9,908 contributors. In 1942, under Sobeloff's leadership, the Allied Jewish Campaign raised \$900,000 and had over 22,000 contributions. During Sobeloff's tenure in Detroit, he raised more than \$125 million. Sobeloff also served in many other positions, including Secretary of the Allotment Committee of the United Jewish Appeal (1942), President of the National Conference of Jewish Social Welfare (1944), and member of the Jewish Center Division Executive Committee, National Jewish Welfare Board.

From 1964 through 1969, Sobeloff served as Director of the Jewish Federation Council of Greater Los Angeles.

Isidore Sobeloff died in November 1995, at the age of 99.
