The papers of the United Community Services School Program Division were placed in the Archives of Labor and Urban Affairs in April of 1982 and were opened for research in December of 1986.

Meetings to establish a School Program within the United Community Services began in 1937. The School Program department was designed to acquaint school children with the social problems in the community and the public and private services established to meet those problems. Various media and conferences were developed to communicate information to students and teachers in the Detroit metropolitan area.

The papers of the School Program reflect the efforts of area educators and social agencies to work together to better serve community needs in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties in the 1950s and 1960s. The School Program is now defunct.



Although they all had similar programs and were coordinated by the same School program staff, each had its own members, minutes, and problems. On 11 June 1943 the Wyondotte-Trenton branch and two other Wayne County councils agreed to consolidate into one Downriver Council. Of the three, only the Wyondotte-Trenton files are included in this series, and are labeled as Downriver Council files. Materials are predominantly from 1956-1967. 
