The files and records of the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) and its predecessor agencies were transferred to the Archives of Labor and Urban Affairs in October 1980 by Paul E. Tait, Director of Administrative Services, SEMCOG. The first fifteen boxes of this collection contain the files of the Detroit Metropolitan Area Regional Planning Commission (DRPC), which became the Planning Division of SEMCOG in 1968.

The DRPC was established in 1947 by an act of the Michigan State Legislature and received financial support from the state and participating counties. Members counties included Wayne, Macomb and Oakland, with Monroe County participating from 1955-61 and Washtenaw County after 1961. The DRPC was directed by an Advisory Commission, whose members were appointed by the governor, and an Executive Committee. The function of the DRPC was the coordination of planning programs in the area. It encouraged and assisted local planning programs, collected area planning data and provided a channel through which area planning programs could meet requirements for federal aid programs.

In 1965, a special Transportation and Land Use Study (TALUS) was instituted to develop a comprehensive 1990 regional plan. This branch of the DRPC operated almost as an independent unit and received separate funding. It was phased out in 1969.

In the mid-1960's, studies were conducted on means by which the various regional planning agencies, primarily the DRPC and another predecessor agency, the Supervisors Inter-County Committee (SICC), could coalesce into one regional agency to avoid duplication of programs and services. In 1968, the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) was created and the DRPC became the Planning Division of that agency.

The operations and programs of the DRPC did not change in any significant manner following the changeover. Paul M. Reid, the Executive Director of the DRPC became the Director of the Planning Division of SEMCOG, and various technical committees continued their assignments.

The papers in this collection are from the office of Mr. Reid and contain information related to the organization and operations of the DRPC, and the findings of various planning projects and studies conducted by the DRPC and Planning Division of SEMCOG.

Minutes of committee meetings of the Detroit Metropolitan Regional Planning Commission (DRPC), including early SEMCOG material. Contains information regarding the administrative, operational and technical activities of the organization. Also included are some agendas, attached correspondence and reports, and committee member rosters. Files are arranged according to the hierarchy of the organization and secondarily by date. Minutes of the Quarterly Commission Meetings and Executive Committee Meetings are in bound volumes. This series also contains minutes of the Transportation Land Use Study (TALUS) meetings.

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Series II DRPC Division Office Files, 1947-70 (Predominantly 1960-68) Boxes 8-11

Reports, charts, maps, surveys, correspondence, contracts and related state and national legislation. Contains information concerning organizational formation, procedures, budgets, services and projects of the DRPC, including much statistical data and analysis about the Detroit metropolitan region. Includes information on the changeover from DRPC to SEMCOG and TALUS Director's reports. Files are arranged by subject groupings; general office files precede project completion reports and project surveys. Topics covered in Michigan Project Completion Reports are outlined on page 9.

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Series III DRPC Division Correspondence, 1960-65 Boxes 12-15

Daily files of outgoing correspondence, primarily from Paul M. Reid. Contains information regarding DRPC operations and planning objectives; letters to legislators and other prominent political figures primarily request support and explain planning programs and DRPC objectives. Files are arranged alphabetically and secondarily by date.
