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## History

The group received recognition from Michigan legislatures and the Detroit Police Department for their efforts toward community improvement.

Partners included Grace Lutheran Church, Catholic Youth Organization, Protestant Community Services, and Catholic Social Services of Wayne County to the form the Inter-Faith Community Program.

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## Scope and Content

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The record group consists of textual records and photographs created or received by the St. Anthony Community Council. The material contained emphasizes the Council's projects, publications, and correspondence. These types of materials include newsletters, flyers, meeting notes, letters, and newspaper articles.
