Courses in French, German, Italian, and Spanish were taught in the Detroit Junior College which later became the College of the City of Detroit in 1923. The College along with the Detroit College of Medicine and Surgery, and the Detroit Teachers College along with other schools were organized as a university under the Detroit Board of Education in 1933. The consolidation of the language departments into the Department of Romance and Germanic Languages and Literature under the chairmanship of Professor V. Frederic Koenig began September 1963.

Professor Grace A. Hill was named the first head of the French Department in 1925 and held the position until her retirement in 1944. Her title was unique among her women colleagues of the College of Liberal Arts faculty until 1943.

Professor Dominic Louis Pucci was chairman of the Spanish and Italian Departments from 1930 until the departments merged into the Department of Romance and Germanic Languages and Literature. He remained at Wayne State until his retirement in 1970.
