Josephine Fellows Gomon, born in Ann Arbor and a graduate of the University of Michigan, was a teacher of mathematics and physics at the old College of the City of Detroit, now Wayne State University. As executive secretary to Mayor Frank Murphy from 1930 to 1933 in a period of severe economic deprivation, she shared in shaping new policies with which Detroit met an unprecedented emergency with a vigorous program for relieving human suffering. As chairman of Detroit's first Housing Commission, Josephine Gomon gave vigorous leadership to the clearance of blighted areas of the city, to the building of the Brewster and Parkside projects, and to the planning and financing of Herman Gardens.

Josephine Gomon has distinguished herself in this community by her continual fearless and independent active citizenship in behalf of social well-being. Her high respect for privacy of thought and feeling has motivated her to initiate and to advance movements to protect and defend the inherent rights of the individual. She has labored in the interest of human rights as the advancing industrial order challenges the individual citizen. She has worked to protect workers' families affected by industrial transition, to make better education available to the poor as it is to the rich, to assure the right of petition, the right of freedom from compulsory disclosure, the right of courteous service and humane treatment of prisoners.

She has helped to set the modern social revolution on a peaceful course toward meeting the social and political challenges of an advancing social order.

EERO SAARINEN

B.F.A., Hon. M.A.

Eero Saarinen, honored alumnus of Yale University; Fellow, the American Institute of Architects, the International Institute of Arts and Letters, and the American Academy of Arts and Letters; recipient of numerous American Institute of Architects Honor Awards; and winner, with Associates, of the three major national architectural competitions in recent years; he is now principal partner in the architectural firm of Eero Saarinen and Associates.

Internationally renowned as an architect of consummate taste and masterly skill, his public commissions have consistently demonstrated a happy fusion of sound structural engineering, imaginative designing, rich and varied materials, and skillfully ordered function. Recognized as a thoughtful analyst and writer on architectural matters; acclaimed as designer of a group of furniture embodying new and dramatic concepts of functional form; he is most noted as a specialist in solving the intricate organizational and aesthetic problems of large scale industrial, research, governmental, and educational complexes.

Wayne State University salutes the creative genius of Eero Saarinen whose works have immeasurably increased the rich endowment of our present cultural heritage.

LUDWIG MIES VAN DER ROHE

Ludwig Mies van der Rohe, a native of Germany and now a citizen of the United States, was one of that small but brilliant band of pioneers who, after World War I, raised the banner of revolt against the sham and sterility of nineteenth century architecture.

Not only a great architect but also a great teacher, he carried across the Atlantic the gospel of a New Architecture, based upon the technology, and facing the challenge of the twentieth century. He has expressed our age through his imaginative use of new materials and processes.

The revolution of yesterday is the accepted order of today. The general adoption of the principles of modern architecture is strikingly expressed in the profound transformation of our physical environment.

From the Bauhaus in Dessau to the Illinois Institute of Technology in Chicago, Mies van der Rohe has preached and practiced an architecture of intellectual strength, structural purity and artistic integrity.

RICHARD STANLEY MERRILL EMRICH

Richard Stanley Merrill Emrich, born of American missionary parents in Turkey; a graduate of Brown University and Union Theological Seminary, earning the doctorate at the University of Marburg; ordained a priest of the Protestant Episcopal Church in 1936, he has been Bishop of the Diocese of Michigan since 1948.

Winning early recognition as a distinguished teacher, scholar, and author, he has brought to this community the leadership consonant with our highest aspirations. He has instituted and supported new concepts for the education and development of the clergy, for their recruitment and training, and for internship programs in church work, social service, and institutional chaplaincies. A dramatic growth in all aspects of social responsibilities attendant upon the religious life is reflected in an increasing involvement of the lay people, in fine programs for youth, in adult religious education, in housing for the sick and aged, but chiefly in a new dedication to concern for welfare of the whole community.

As spokesman for many civic committees dealing with problems of human rights, dignity, and liberties, he has courted no easy popularity. To this metropolitan area he has often demonstrated that his belief in the brotherhood of man is for him a way of life.

PAULINE PARK WILSON KNAPP

B.S., A.M., Ph.D.

Native born Pauline Park Wilson Knapp, author and member of several honorary societies and social agency boards, is President of the Merrill-Palmer Institute, an internationally known center for research on family life and human development.

From her student days at the University of Kentucky, when as an under-graduate she came to study at the Merrill-Palmer School, through her doctoral study at Columbia University, she has furthered the view that the fate of nations depends on the quality of family life.

She was an early leader in the child development movement, one of the first professors in that field, and encouraged the growth of nursery schools as laboratories for the study of children and their families.

Her research in the education of women and encouragement of their self-realization has contributed insights to help women avoid a sense of futility after their child bearing years. This research fostered her development of the "College Women's Volunteer Service," not only in Detroit but throughout the State of Michigan, and resulted in several nationally known books on the subject.

Her outstanding leadership at the Merrill-Palmer Institute has brought students to Detroit from all parts of the world as well as the United States to share in learning that the community is a reflection of many kinds of families, and has also created an image of the Institute as a meeting place for family problems and research for the solution of those problems.

RICHARD HARDING McFEELY

Richard Harding McFeely, magnetic teacher, sympathetic advisor of students, leader in American secondary education, he has translated a personal testimony to the power of mind and spirit in determining the fullness of human accomplishment into an active philosophy of education. His sensitive statement of the role and responsibility of independent schools has led them by creative experiment to establish distinguished standards of excellence for American secondary education. His concern and rich gifts for leadership in education, religion, international affairs, and human relations have been recognized many times by those who have asked and received his generous service.

Widely known as author of experimental programs in the teaching of social studies in secondary schools and for his penetrating articles on social, religious and racial problems, a large part of his contribution to education lies in the outstanding leadership he has given to the George School which claims his full devotion.

The impact and measure of his accomplishment stand in the lives of those privileged to call him teacher.

ON CAPS, GOWNS, AND HOODS

One of the most colorful features of an academic procession is the appearance of the graduates, the faculty, members of the governing board, and guests of the University in fully academic costume. These caps, gowns, and hoods have long histories and their patterns and colors have special significance.

The gown recalls the time when all students in centers of higher learning were clerics, that is, members of the clergy, and therefore wore the garments which the Church considered proper for them.

The custom of wearing a cap comes from the Roman usage of conferring the right to wear a cap upon slaves when they were granted their freedom. At Scottish universities, such as St. Andrews, doctors are created by a ceremony called "capping" in which a cap is placed on their heads.

In modern universities, the distinctive mark of a degree is the hood. In its earliest form, the hood was simply an article of wearing apparel. The churches and lecture halls of European universities were cold, drafty places, so scholars wore hoods merely as head coverings, sometimes attached to a cape, sometimes worn separately.

American universities, unlike those of England and Europe, have adopted a standard code of academic costume. The cut and material of the gown, the color of the tassel on the cap, and the pattern and colors of the hood all have special significance.

Each person who is to receive a degree wears the gown appropriate to the degree to be granted. If he already holds a degree, he wears the hood of that degree, not the one he is to receive.

Bachelors' gowns are closed at the throat and have long, pointed sleeves. Masters' gowns are open in the front and have long sleeves, square and closed at the end, the arms coming through slits near the elbow. Doctors' gowns are faced with velvet and have full, round sleeves. Each sleeve carries three bars of velvet, called chevrons.

The most colorful part of the costume is the hood. The color of the lining identifies the university which granted the highest degree held by the wearer. The color of the velvet trim indicates the faculty or department of learning in which the degree was earned.

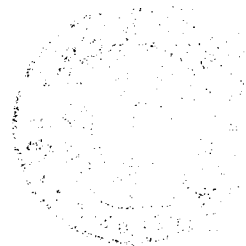

William Foxwell Albright, distinguished scholar, master of the languages and literatures of the Near East, great Biblical archaeologist, humanist, scientist, has brought to his research an incomparably rich and creative imagination, an extraordinary genius, and a supreme gift of synthesis to the result that he has become a dominant figure in his fields of study. His work has helped to make archaeology a precise science. His excavations in Biblical sites of the thirteenth and the sixth centuries before Christ have transformed views in Bible studies and have aided in making American Bible scholarship independent of Europe and in many ways a guide to the world. Through his work, Biblical traditions have come to be seen in their Near Eastern context and in the proper perspective.

He is author of more than eight hundred scholarly publications of which several are available in a number of languages. He has long been a member of many foreign national academies. He is a member of the National Academy of Sciences. He is a Protestant but is a member of the Catholic Biblical Association of America. He is a Christian yet was commissioned by the Jewish Theological Seminary to write the history of Judaism in Biblical times and has been a visiting professor at Hebrew Union College - Jewish Institute of Religion. For his great contributions to scholarship, he has received eighteen honorary doctorates from institutions on three continents.

Wayne State University honors William Foxwell Albright for his distinguished achievements and for his demonstration that the Judeo-Christian tradition of the intrinsic worth of the individual remains the most solid bulwark of the rights of man.

ON CAPS, GOWNS, AND HOODS

One of the most colorful features of an academic procession is the appearance of the graduates, the faculty, members of the governing board, and guests of the University in fully academic costume. These caps, gowns, and hoods have long histories and their patterns and colors have special significance.

The gown recalls the time when all students in centers of higher learning were clerics, that is, members of the clergy, and therefore wore the garments which the Church considered proper for them.

The custom of wearing a cap comes from the Roman usage of conferring the right to wear a cap upon slaves when they were granted their freedom. At Scottish universities, such as St. Andrews, doctors are created by a ceremony called "capping" in which a cap is placed on their heads.

In modern universities, the distinctive mark of a degree is the hood. In its earliest form, the hood was simply an article of wearing apparel. The churches and lecture halls of European universities were cold, drafty places, so scholars wore hoods merely as head coverings, sometimes attached to a cape, sometimes worn separately.

American universities, unlike those of England and Europe, have adopted a standard code of academic costume. The cut and material of the gown, the color of the tassel on the cap, and the pattern and colors of the hood all have special significance.

Each person who is to receive a degree wears the gown appropriate to the degree to be granted. If he already holds a degree, he wears the hood of that degree, not the one he is to receive.

Bachelors' gowns are closed at the throat and have long, pointed sleeves. Masters' gowns are open in the front and have long sleeves, square and closed at the end, the arms coming through slits near the elbow. Doctors' gowns are faced with velvet and have full, round sleeves. Each sleeve carries three bars of velvet, called chevrons.

The most colorful part of the costume is the hood. The color of the lining identifies the university which granted the highest degree held by the wearer. The color of the velvet trim indicates the faculty or department of learning in which the degree was earned.
