Miss Alda H. Wilson - B.C.E. 1894. Took some architectural work at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and practiced in architect's drafting office in New York City until 1917; then in charge of women's drafting room, Iowa State Highway Commission until 1919; now returned to architectural work.

Nettie Fibbs Zorn - B.C.E. 1896. Deceased 1906. Taught in public high schools and then married Mr. G.W. Zorn, B.C.E. 1896.

Mary Yeisley Dyer - B.C.E. 1906. Completed most of her civil engineering work with the Class of 1890. Married B. M. Dyer, B.M.E. Class of 1891. Address Puget Sound Bridge & Dredging Company, Seattle, Wash.

Florence Kimball Stoufer - B.M.E. 1908. Had business connection with foundry owned by her family until her marriage to D. B. Stoufer, B.M.E. 1908.


