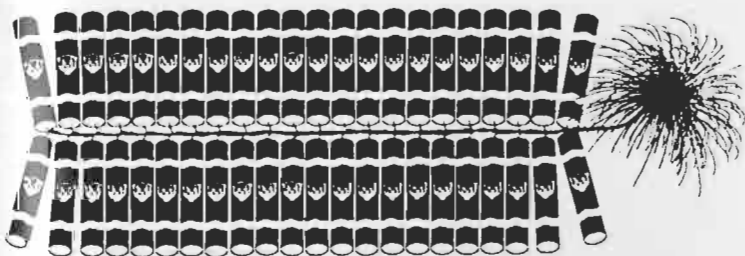
JROTC
