Abstract:	Victor Reuther began his UAW career as an organizer for Local 174 in 1937, the same year he participated in the Flint Sit-Down Strike. In the 1940s he moved up to the UAW national organization, serving in several leadership positions culminating in the directorship of the International Affairs Office from which he retired in 1972. His papers reflect his work with the UAW, especially relating to international community organizations. The material in the collections was originally used by Reuther in writing his book, <i>The Brothers Reuther</i> , published in 1976. Subjects include: International Metalworkers Federation; International Confederation of Free Trade Unions; American Institute for Free Labor Development; UAW factionalism; and the UAW break with the AFL-CIO.

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History

Victor Reuther was born in Wheeling, West Virginia on January 1, 1912. He was educated at the Wheeling Public Schools, the University of West Virginia, and the College of the City of Detroit, which

is now Wayne State University. After leaving the College in 1932, he and Walter Reuther Campaigned for Norman Thomas, and in February of 1933 they went on a world tour which included working in the Soviet Union from 1933-1935. When he returned to Detroit, he worked for the Kelsey Hayes wheel factory, and in December 1936 he participated in a strike. He was one of the leaders in the Flint Sit-Down strike of 1937. From 1937-1938, he worked as an organizer for UAW local union 174. From 1941-1946, he was the assistant coordinator for the UAW War Policy Division. From 1946-1949, he was director of the Education Department. From 1951-1953, he worked for the CIO European Office. In 1953 he was appointed director of the CIO International Affairs Department. Soon after the CIO was merged with the AFL, he was named director of the UAW International Affairs Department. He remained in this position until he retired in May 1972.

In addition to his work in the trade union movement, Mr. Reuther participated in many community groups, especially Americans for Democratic Action (ADA), D.B, Branch, Bread for the World, Democratic Socialist Organizing Committee (DSOC) and Federalism Seventy-Six.

Soon after Victor Reuther retired in May, 1972, he began work on a book, The Brothers Reuther, which was published by the Houghton Mifflin Co. in 1976. The records of this collection were mainly used to document the book.

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Scope and Content

These papers of Victor Reuther reflect his work with the UAW, especially relating to international community organizations.

Important subjects covered in the collection are: Aid to Underdeveloped Countries, 1955-1980 AFL-CIO, especially the International Affairs Department, 1956-1980 American Institute for Free Labor Development, 1962-1980 Central Intelligence Agency, 1956-1980 International Confederation of Free Trade Unions, 1956-1971 International Metalworkers Federation, 1956-1971 Trade Union Conditions in Foreign Countries, 1956-1980 UAW Conflict with AFL-CIO, 1956-1972 UAW Factional Disputes, 1937-1941

Series Description: Series I, Reuther Brothers, Early Years, 1920-1972: Correspondence, oral interviews and other materials relating to the activities of Victor and Walter Reuther before they joined the UAW. These records document their school activities, their world tour and their work with the Socialist Party.

Series II, Reuther Brothers, UAW activity 1936-1941: Correspondence and other material relating to the work of Victor and Walter Reuther during the formative years of the UAW. These records particularly

discuss the factional disputes within the Union and the participation of John L. Lewis in trying to settle them. Other files document organizing activities.

Series III, Reuther Brothers, War and Post War Activity, 1940-1954: Correspondence and other materials relating to the activities of Victor and Walter Reuther during the years of World War II and its aftermath. These records document war production problems, 1940-1945, and post-war events in Germany and the United States. Such events include the proposal to dismantle German steel factories, General Motors contract negotiations, and the shootings of Victor and Walter Reuther.

Series IV, CIO International Affairs 1949-1955: Correspondence and other materials relating to the work of Victor Reuther while he was employed by the CIO. Most of these records discuss foreign relations.

Series V, UAW International Affairs Department, 1925-1972: Correspondence and other materials relating to the activity of Victor Reuther as director of the UAW International Affairs Department.

Subseries A, Non UAW individuals and organizations, 1956-1972, Correspondence and other materials relating to private individuals and organizations.

Subseries B, U.S. Government Executive Agencies and Congress, 1958-1972, Correspondence and other materials relating to the federal government.

Subseries C, Legislation, 1956-1971, Correspondence, testimony and other materials relating to legislative lobbying activity.

Subseries D, UAW Departments, Local Unions and Regional Offices, 1956-1972, Correspondence, appointment schedules and other materials relating to the UAW.

Subseries E, AFL-CIO Departments and Unions, 1925-1971, Correspondence and other materials relating to the AFL-CIO. Most of these files discuss the philosophical differences between the UAW and the AFL-CIO about international trade union policy.

Subseries F, Foreign Countries, 1956-1972, Correspondence and other materials relating to foreign countries. These records describe economic, political and trade union conditions throughout the world.

Subseries G, International Metalworkers Federation, 1956-1972, Correspondence and other materials relating to the IMF. Most of these records consist of correspondence with general secretaries.

Subseries H, International Confederation of Free Trade Unions, 1956-1971, Correspondence and other materials relating to the ICFTU. many of these files document the conflict of the UAW with the AFL-CIO.

Series VI, Election Campaigns, 1950-1954 and 1960-1968: Correspondence, speeches and other materials relating to federal government elections. Some of the files relate to the activities of Victor and Walter Reuther in the elections, 1950-1954. Other records document the campaign activities of the UAW Citizenship Department, 1960-1968.

Series VII, Retirement years, 1972-1981: Correspondence and other materials relating to the activity of Victor Reuther after he retired from the UAW.

Subseries A, Non UAW individuals and organizations, 1972-1980, Correspondence and other materials relating to private individuals and organizations. Many of these files concern multinational corporations. Other records relate to democratic socialist groups.

Subseries B, U.S. Government Executive Agencies and Congress, 1972-1980, Correspondence and other materials relating to the federal government.

Subseries C, Election Campaigns, 1972-1980, Correspondence and other materials relating to federal government elections. Most of these records discuss the 1972 presidential campaign of George McGovern. Other records concern the 1974 campaign of John Reuther for Congress.

Subseries D, UAW Departments, Local Unions, and Regional Offices, 1972-1981, Correspondence and other materials relating to the UAW.

Subseries E, AFL-CIO, 1972-1979, Correspondence and other materials relating to the AFL-CIO.

Subseries F, Foreign Countries and IMF, 1972-1980, Correspondence and other materials relating to foreign countries and the IMF. Most of these files relate to foreign countries. At the end of this subseries, there are three folders of data relating to the IMF.

Series VIII, Drafts of Manuscripts about the Reuthers, 1964-1972: Drafts of manuscripts written about the Reuther family by Lorena Hickok, Frank Cormier and William Eaton, and Paul Douglass.

Series IX, Drafts of Manuscript and Research notes for Brothers Reuther, 1972-1976: Most of this material is drafts of manuscripts. There is a transfile containing notes which are on 5x8 index cards.

Series X, Personal friends and family, 1890-1980: Correspondence and other materials relating to the personal friends and family of Victor Reuther.

Series IX, Audiovisual materials and artifacts, 1890s-1980s: Photographs, Reuther family personal artifacts, antique books, audio recordings, and items from Victor and Walter's world tour.

Series I: Reuther Brothers, Early Years, 1920-1972

Scope and Contents

Correspondence, membership cards, composition books, drawings, creative essays, poems, Soviet Union production books, excerpts from the Diary of Victor Reuther, notes, oral interviews and other items relating to the activity of Victor and Walter Reuther before they joined the UAW. These records document their school work in West Virginia and Michigan, their world tour, and their socialist activity. These records are arranged in general chronological sequence, and they are predominantly dated 1928-1936. There are a few items prior to 1928. There are four oral interviews given by Victor Reuther in 1972 which discuss the activity of Walter Reuther, 1925-1932. The oral recollections of Valentine Reuther about his early trade union experiences which were recorded in 1963 are at the end of the series.

Scope and Contents

Correspondence, minutes, press releases, reports, clippings and other items relating to the activity of Victor and Walter Reuther during World War II and in the post war era. These records document war production problems in the U.S. and post war problems in Germany, especially the proposal to dismantle its steel industry. Other files relate to post war events in the U.S. such as the General Motors contract negotiations and the shootings of Victor and Walter Reuther. Some of the documents in this series are copies of items in other collections which Mr. Reuther acquired. The records of this series are predominantly dated 1941-1949. There are a few items which fall outside of

these dates, and many of the clippings about the shootings are dated 1950-1954. The records of this subseries are divided into two sections, and within each section they are arranged alphabetically by topic.

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Series IX: Drafts of Manuscripts and Research Notes for "The Brothers Reuther," circa 1972-1976

Scope and Contents

"Drafts of manuscripts, insertions and notes. soon after he retired in May, 1972, Victor Reuther began to write his book. He completed three major drafts of the manuscript. The first, has thirty-three chapters. (chapters 15-18 are missing) After reading it, he make Xerox copies and make corrections in ink or pencil, placed insertions into the manuscript, and he rewrote some of the chapters. Chapters 6,7 and 14 of the revised draft are quite different

from those of the original. Mr. Reuther then wrote a second draft which has twenty-nine chapters. (chapter 21 is missing). After reading these chapters, he made corrections and produced a revised draft for chapters 1-17, part of Chapter 18, and chapter 20. There is no revised draft for part of chapter 18, for chapter 19 are for chapters 21-29. Before writing a third draft, he re-read the second draft again and made more corrections. For most of the second draft there are three versions - second draft, second revised draft (for most of the chapters), and second corrected draft. In December, 1975 Victor Reuther began to write a third and final draft of twenty-nine chapters. Most of the notes for The Brothers Reuther are on 5x8 inch index cards. Most of these notes are typed; some are handwritten. They are placed in a special oversized box and are organized into twenty-eight topics which are arranged in general chronological order. A description of these notes is listed at the end of this series."

Most of these letters are dated 1955-1980. Much of this correspondence is from Theodore Reuther, valentine Reuther and from Victor Reuther to friends which discuss the activities of his children; many of these letters concern Eric Reuther. There are other letters from Roy and Fonia Reuther, from Christine Rickey, from Alan Reuther and from Eric, John and Carol Reuther. There are limited letters from Sophie Reuther and only one letter from Walter Reuther. These letters are arranged chronologically. The cards are in a special folder which is placed after the letters. Next, there are subject files, consisting mostly, but not entirely, of correspondence. These records relate to the Reuther family origins from

Germany; to special activity of Valentine Reuther; to the European visits of Anna and Valentine Reuther, 1954; to death of Valentine Reuther, 1967; to the old age problems of Anna Reuther after the death of her husband; and the death of Anna Reuther, 1972. There is one folder of records concerning the activities of May Wolf, including some undated letters to Walter Reuther. At the end of the series are some passports which are in a special folder.
