The papers of Jewell Mills were deposited with the Labor History Archives in April, 1968, by Jewell Mills.

Jewell Mills was born in 1925 in Sequoia, California. He received a B.A. degree and teaching certificate from Kansas State Teachers College at Emporia, Kansas, and an M.A. degree from the University of Michigan at Ann Arbor. He is a member of the American Association of Mentally Defficient Children and a member of the International Council for Exceptional Children.

In 1948 he was active in organizing local 1448 - Utica Federation of Teachers, AFL-CIO. He is also currently a member of the United Plant Guards of America. From 1964 through 1967 "Joe" Mills was a Vice President of the Michigan Federation of Teachers and three times delegate to the State Convention. In 1968 he was also a delegate to the National American Federation of Teachers Convention at Cleveland.

The Jewel Mills Collection covers the period from 1962 to 1968. The records are mainly printed resolutions, proposals, etc.
