Ted F. Silvey was born in 1904 in Manchester, New Hampshire and grew up in Zanesville, Ohio. He returned to the east coast in the 1920s and began his career as a printer's devil and typesetter-compositor in New York. He worked at the printer's trade in Brooklyn and in Zanesville and Columbus, Ohio. In 1935, he became the editor for the Columbus AFL newspaper and in 1938, went to work for the Ohio state CIO Council, moving through the ranks as an organizer, Secretary-Treasurer, and Legislative Representative. In 1944, he joined the Speaker's Bureau of the national CIO, where his duties included teaching at labor union schools and lecturing at union meetings, and conferences as well as before non-union audiences. Mr. Silvey authored several articles on labor-related topics (copies of which may be found in the collection), especially the effects of automation on the workforce.

In addition to his CIO responsibilities, Mr. Silvey worked as the Scientific Consultant for the U.S. Military Government in Germany (1946-47), studying accident prevention and occupational disease control, as Executive Director of the Labor Office in the Marshall Plan, and as Acting Administrator of the Labor Office in the National Production Authority from 1950-51.

The Ted F. Silvey Collection contains his research files on automation, computer and industrial technology, and labor topics; his speeches, lectures, and articles; CIO pamphlets; and some office correspondence.
