The papers of Eleanor Wolf were placed in the Archives of Labor and Urban Affairs in January of 1979, May of 1983, May of 1984, October of 1984, and February of 1986, and were opened for research in May of 1989.

Eleanor Paperno Wolf was born in 1917. She obtained her undergraduate degree from Wayne State University; and subsequently received a Ph.D degree in Sociology from Wayne State in 1959. Ms. Wolf taught in the Sociology Department at Wayne State until she retired as Professor Emerita in the mid 1980's.

The papers of Ms. Wolf consist of several programs containing speeches of Walter Reuther plus clippings and correspondence relating to the Walter Reuther Youth Center in Israel. Other material includes bulletins and newsletters relating to the Bagley Community Council, a neighborhood organization in Northwest Detroit active in community affairs in the mid sixties. Also included is a page of minutes of a meeting of the Wayne State Chapter of the American Student Union held in January of 1938.
