The papers of W. G. Wamsley were placed in the Archives of Labor and Urban Affairs in July of 1986 by his son Allen W. Wamsley and were opened for research in November of 1988. A tape recording was later deposited in October of 1987 and placed in the Archives Audio Visual Collection.

W. G. Wamsley was an employee of the Chrysler Corporation in the late thirties. He died in 1984.

The papers of Mr. Wamsley consist primarily of a partial description of a proposed invention by Mr. Wamsley plus an excerpt a Chrysler corporation memo relating to unionization of employees. The papers also include several pieces of correspondence of his son Allen W. Wamsley relating to the deposit of his father's papers in the Archives of Labor and Urban Affairs.
