CONVENTION ANNOUNCEMENTS & PROGRAM

Headquarters

The First Biennial Convention of the American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees will convene at 10:00 a.m. Thursday, September 17, 1936 at the Book-Cadillac Hotel in Detroit, Michigan. The convention deliberations will continue until Saturday, Sept. 19, or until the business of the convention has been completed. Officers of the federation will have headquarters at the Book-Cadillac Hotel and will be available to delegates after Monday, September 14.

Hotel Facilities

The following room rates have been made available to delegates by the management of the Book-Cadillac: Single rooms, \$3.00 to \$6.00 per day; double rooms with double bed, \$4.50 to \$8.00 per day; double rooms with twin beds, \$5.00 to \$8.00 per day; suites, \$10.00 to \$20.00 per day. Other hotel rooms with more reasonable rates are available a short distance from the convention headquarters.

Four restaurants of varied types are available at the hotel, in which breakfast is served from 30¢ to 50¢, luncheon from 50¢ to 75¢, dinner from 75¢ to \$1.75.

The management will furnish a room to be designated as the A.F.S.C. and M.E. convention office for the secretary which will be maintained to furnish information and aid to delegates and visitors.

Visitors

A cordial invitation is extended to friends or relatives of delegates, and other interested persons to attend the convention as visitors. Every effort will be made to provide for their convenience.

Convention Program and Speakers

The deliberations of the convention will be concerned with the disposition of resolutions, problems of organization, matters of policy, amendments to the constitution, plans for proposed state and local legislation, a program of education and public welfare, the reports of officers, and the election of officers. Most informative discussions are anticipated.
