History

Bernice Pasche (nee Morgan) was an International Representative for the American Newspaper Guild in the late 1930s. She married Victor Pasche in 1939. Victor Pasche was a newspaper reporter, union official, organizer, and the first Secretary-Treasurer of the American Newspaper Guild. Born in Geneva, he began his reporting career at the New York Times in 1929. Pasche was active in the 1934-1935

Newark Ledger Strike and covered the event as a reporter. He served as the American Newspaper Guild Secretary-Treasurer under the union's founder Heywood Broun from 1933 until 1941, when he withdrew a bid for re-election amid red-baiting. Pasche also served as an organizer for United Electrical, Radio, and Machine Workers and remained active in labor movements throughout his life.

The Victor and Bernice Pasche Papers include correspondence, American Newspaper Guild convention proceedings, union contracts, and labor newspapers and clippings.
