WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE –

BROTHERS AND SISTERS, I AM GLAD TO JOIN YOU AT
THIS INTERNATIONAL LABOR LEADERS' BREAKFAST. I
THINK IT IS A VITALLY IMPORTANT QUESTION TO
RAISE: WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE AS WE WORK TO
ORGANIZE AND BUILD A STRONGER PRO-LABOR, PROJUSTICE MOVEMENT?

WE NEED TO LOOK AT THE SOUTH, A REGION THAT
HAS BEEN LARGELY OVERLOOKED AND UNTAPPED AS
A RESEVOIR OF STRENGTH AND POWER. AS AN
AFRICAN AMERICAN, I ESPECIALLY UNDERSTAND THAT
THE SOUTH IS WHERE THE MAJORITY OF OUR PEOPLE
RESIDE.

THE DEMOGRAPHICS OF THE SOUTH IS ALSO
CHANGING. THERE HAS BEEN A RE-MIGRATION TO THE
SOUTH OF MANY PEOPLE WHO ARE EITHER RETIRING
OR SEEKING A BETTER QUALITY OF LIFE. IT'S IN THE
INTEREST OF THOSE IN THE NORTHEAST AND MIDWEST
AND WEST TO SURE UP THE SOUTH. IF WE CAN MAKE
CERTAIN THAT PEOPLE HAVE A LIVING WAGE AND
THAT WORKER'S RIGHTS ARE PROTECTED IN THE
SOUTH, WE CAN BUILD MOMENTUM THAT MOVES
NATIONWIDE.

LET'S USE MISSISSIPPI AS AN EXAMPLE. WE WORED
THERE TO BUILD A POLLITICAL MOVEMENT.
ALTHOUGH WE WERE NOT SUCCEESSFUL IN THE
GOVERNOR'S RACE, WE GAINED A GREAT DEAL IN OUR
RELATIONSHIP BUILDING. BY MAINTAINING THOSE
RELATIONSHIPS WE HAVE TESTED AND EXPANDED OUR
ORGANIZING STRENGTH.

WE HAVE CONNECED WORKERS IN THE PLANTS WITH
PEOPLE ON THE STREETS. CONTRARY TO THE NOTIONS
OF NAYSAYERS, THE SOUTH CAN BE ORGANIZED.

BUT WE ARE CHALLENGED TO BE SMARTER, BOLDER
AND MORE CREATIVE. BECAUSE WE FACE RIGHT TO
WORK OBSTACLES – WE CERTAINLY LACK ACCESS TO
WORKERS. BUT THIS MEANS, WE FIND OTHER
AVENUES. WE BUILD ALLIANCES. WE WORK THE
LOCAL POLITICS. AND WE CULTIVATE ONE-ON-ONE
RELATIONSHIPS.

IN FACT, RELATIONSHIPS BECOME MORE IMPORTANT
ACROSS THE BOARD: CONNECTIONS WITH COMMUNITY
LEADERS; WITH MINISTERS, WITH THE PEOPLE WHO
ARE NOT OBVIOUS LEADERS, BUT THEY ARE THE
GRASSROOTS MOVERS AND DOERS.

MY MESSAGE TO YOU IS TO BUILD AND SUSTAIN

COMMUNITY ALLIANCES. WE CANNOT EXPECT

COMMUNITIES TO SUPPORT US IF WE HAVE NOT LAID

THE GROUND AND BUILT THE BRIDGES TO BE PART OF

THE COMMUNITY. PEOPLE NEED TO BELIEVE THAT WE

GENERALLY CARE. IT DOESN'T TAKE A LOT OF

MATERIAL RESOURCES TO DO THIS. BUT IT TAKES THE

TWO MOST VALUABLE RESOURCE WE AS ORGANIZERS

HAVE – TIME AND EXPERIENCE.

I END BY REMINDING ALL OF US THAT BEING A
UNION MEMBER IS NOT JUST ABOUT A FATTER
PAYCHECK. IT'S ABOUT BEING PART OF A
MOVEMENT THAT BELIEVES IN THE WORTH AND
DIGNITY OF EVERY HUMAN BEING.

SO LET'S GET BUSY PROVING THAT WE IN THE TADE UNION MOVEMENT ARE OUR BROTHERS AND SISTERS KEEPERS!
