In 1948 John Livingston was director of the Political Action Department, and Roy Reuther was his administrative assistant. Mr. Reuther became director in early 1949, and Ralph Showalter was his assistant. There were two other members working in the main office – Edward Tonat and Salome Williams, who was the secretary. When Ralph Showalter left in June, 1952, he was replaced by Edward Purdy. In July, 1956, William Dodds joined the staff as assistant coordinator. In 1955 the name of the department was changed to the Political Action Committee, but there was no re-organization until August, 1957, when the name was changed to the Citizenship Department. For convenience of description, the Citizenship Department files are in a separate collection.

Correspondence, press releases, reports, financial records, reports from UAW regional representatives, publicity material, clippings and handwritten notes. These records pertain to the general election campaign of 1948, and most of the material relates to U.S. Congressional campaigns. The records were created while Roy Reuther was the administrative assistant to John Livingston, who was director of the Political Action Department. The records are divided into two sections - Office Files which are arranged alphabetically, and UAW Regions, which are arranged numerically. To assist the researcher, the folder entries provide information about the geographical location of the regions. (For space purposes, some of the states within a given region are abbreviated. Those states which are abbreviated are ones in which the UAW did not actively engage in election activity.) At the end of each region, there are folders labeled election campaigns and correspondence with Congressmen. These records consist mostly of correspondence relating to U.S. Congressional elections. Most of the records in this series are dated 1948. A few of the records are dated 1947 and 1949. Because these records cover a limited time period, no dates are listed on the folder entries. Most of the records in this series relate to the role of the UAW in Congressional elections within each region, and this topic is well documented.

Most of these records consist of correspondence with staff members of the regions, and to assist the researcher, there are secondary entries which indicate the names of the staff members. There are some other records relating to citizenship councils, and local unions. With the exception of Michigan, there are records relating to election campaigns and to correspondence with U.S. Congressmen about their campaigns. These records are in folders which are placed at the end of each region. The records concerning congressional elections in Michigan are found in series ten. The records of series five are arranged numerically by number of region. The staff members are listed first and the other categories - citizenship councils, local unions, and elections and correspondence with congressmen are listed next. To assist the researcher, the folder entries provide information about the geographical location of the regions. For space purposes, some of the states within a given region are abbreviated. Most of those states which are abbreviated are ones in which the UAW did not actively engage in election activity. Most of the records in this series relate to the role of the UAW in congressional elections within each region, and this topic is well documented. There is a large amount of material concerning a factional conflict in local union 12, Toledo, Ohio, and an investigation into the business affairs of Richard Gosser, who was a member of this local union and a vice-president of the International UAW. The factional conflict and the Gosser investigation occurred in 1950.

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The records of section one pertain to election campaigns. They are arranged chronologically, and secondary folder entries indicate particular elections. These records relate to various state and congressional elections, and correspondence with candidates about their campaigns is included. Since the records are arranged by date of election, some folders may contain records which are dated the year before or the year after the election. Some of the correspondence in folders labeled 1950 elections, for example, is actually dated 1948 or 1949. Because this collection contains records dated until August 15, 1957, the records of the 1957 spring primary election are included in this series. All of the records relating to the 1958 elections are in the Citizenship Department Collection. The records of section two relate to campaign issues, and they are arranged alphabetically. There is a large amount of documentation on the governor elections, on voter registration in Wayne County, on fair employment practices legislation, on unemployment compensation legislation, and on proposals to reapportion state legislative districts. There is also documentation on primary elections.
