The papers of Local 602 were placed in the Archives of Labor History and Urban Affairs, on February 24, 1969 by the Local's Executive Board, under the presidency of Richard Sanborn, with the support of the union membership. This collection is under the UAW twenty year restriction. Only that portion of the collection created beyond the twenty year time limit is open to scholars.

This local is located in Lansing, Michigan and services the Fisher Body Division of General Motors. The papers represent routine items in the life of the local which celebrated its "thirty year" anniversary early in 1969. The collection documents Local 602's contribution to the development of the UAW plus its own unique aid to the advancement of labor, its members, families and the community of Lansing.

Series I, Boxes 1-35 - Office Files

Correspondence, minutes of meetings, telegrams, forms, notebooks, broadsides, financial records, and audits. This material relates not only to the local's fundamental purpose of organization for worker's welfare, wages and conditions but also the administrative routine, the community service interests and the social activities of the union.

Series II, Boxes 36-37 - Shop Committee

Shop Committeemen's books; Fisher Body Division. These books of the union's representative at the Shop Committee-Management meetings.

Series III, Box 38 - Seniority

Seniority schedules and lists. The material includes pre-1950 seniority lists and subsequent seniority lists in compliance with a G.M. agreement (Paragraph No. 61-A)

Series IV, Boxes 38-39 - Negotiations

Chronological arrangement of agreements, decisions, demands, guidelines, instructions, negotiating and special meetings. Used for "intra" union reference.

Series V, Boxes 40-41 - Social Building Club

The chronological arrangement of all papers, files, and books relating to the development and maintenance of the Union's controversial Social Building Club, Incorporated.

Office Files

Correspondence, broadsides, bulletins, clippings, financial audit forms, grievances, minutes of meetings, negotiations, roster of members and officers, and notes. Directives and telegrams from the UAW International are also included. This series is arranged chronologically, covers the earliest years of the union's establishment (late 1939 to 1961). The material dates as early as 1937 but the bulk of material dates from the late forties into more recent times.

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Shop Committee

The notebooks compiled by the Shop Committeemen of local 602 of the meeting with the management of General Motors Corporation, Fisher Body Division. This series also contains binders of wage agreements, wage rates, and reports used in connection with the discussions at the meeting. The material is typed or mimeographed with handwritten notations. "Guidelines for Shop Committee" is included. The arrangement is chronological, January 1939 to 1961.

Seniority schedules, lists and groupings. It is arranged chronologically within the folders. The schedules are bound in notebooks.

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Series IV
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Negotiations

Agreements, classifications, decisions of umpires, meetings, negotiations and special management-shop committee meetings minutes. This material was used by the union in correlation with specific work related to concerns of arbitration, demands, and grievances, for reference in procedures of precedence with the management or other management-labor concerns. The arrangement is by subject in chronological order. The range is from 1941 to 1958.

All material related to the establishment, construction and use of the local's Social Building Club, Incorporated. It includes, audits correspondence, bank statements, by-laws, commissary notes, financial records, reports, inventories, ledgers, tax returns, membership records, policies, legal materials, and vouchers. Bound journal records are also in this series. The material is arranged chronologically through the subject headings. Box 40 covers the dates 1946-1959 while box 41 coverage includes 1952 through 1955.
