The papers of the Coalition of Labor Union Women, Seattle, Washington were placed in the Archives of Labor and Urban Affairs in July of 1976 by Ms. Anne Guerry Hoddersen, a member of International Brotherhood of Teamsters Local 174 who was active in the Coalition of Labor Union Women (CLUW), Seattle and in the Washington Coalition for Protective Legislation.

The papers consist of correspondence relating to the CLUW convention in Detroit in 1975, proposals submitted to the convention, and memoranda relating to factional disputes within the Seattle chapter and its relationship to the national organization. Other items include bulletins and memoranda dealing with the formation and programs of the Washington Coalition for Protective Legislation, an organization founded in 1975 as an ad hoc group of rank and file unionists, feminists, and other minority groups to fight for legislation to protect workers' rights and health and to reform the state Industrial Welfare Committee (IWC).
