The papers of the Automotive Salesmen's Association were placed in the Archives of Labor and Urban Affairs by the law firm of Gregory, Van Lopik & Korney in July of 1978 and opened for research in July of 2006.

The Automotive Salesmen's Association (ASA) was formed in Dearborn, Michigan in the summer of 1966 with the intention of representing new and used car and truck sales staff in collective bargaining with Ford and Chrysler dealerships in the Detroit area.

The papers of the Automotive Salesmen's Association consist of Board of Directors meeting minutes, a constitution and by-laws, a few issues of Floor Time, the Association's newspaper, and material relating to the ASA's petition to the NLRB requesting a representation election.
