The papers of American Federation of Teachers Local 29, Panama Canal Zone, were placed in the Archives of Labor and Urban Affairs in December of 1980. Additional material was accessioned in February of 1981. The collection was opened for research in July of 1984.

AFT Local 29 was chartered in 1918 by teachers in the American schools of the Panama Canal Zone. It became inactive in 1921 after failing to maintain a large enough active membership. In 1933, two new locals were chartered with the aid of the Panama Canal Metal Trades Council (MTC). Local 227 represented the teachers of the Pacific side of the isthmus, and the smaller Local 228 represented those of the Atlantic side. In 1940 the Metal Trades Council became a Central Labor Union (CLU-MTC) under the AF of L to better serve member unions, which included police, fire-fighters, the Panama Canal Pilots Association, the AFT locals, and other employees of the Panama Canal Company/ Canal Zone Government (PCC/CZG). Canal Zone labor tried to maintain salaries comparable to those paid civil servants in Washington, D.C. In addition, a 13-20% Tropical Differential, a salary bonus for government employees living under adverse tropical conditions, was usually paid.

Problems facing teachers through the early 1970s included obtaining clean safe housing, protection for the jobs and salaries of teachers who married, and payment for extra-curricular assignments. The AFT urged the two locals to join in order to strengthen their position in neg-ocations with the Schools Division. A merger took place on Sept. 1, 1974. This merged local was reissued local number 29

Soon thereafter, treaty talks took place between the U.S. and the Republic of Panama. As a result, the long separate American and Latin American schools systems in the Zone were merged, and in 1979 all U.S. schools in the Zone were transferred to the Department of Defense Dependents School System (DoDDSS). Under the Panama Canal Treaty, the Canal Zone no longer exists, and AFT Local 29 has become the Panama Canal Local 29.
