The papers of the United Automobile Workers - Washington Office, International Affairs Department, Victor Reuther and Lewis Carliner were placed in the Archives of Labor and Urban Affairs in 1971.

The International Affairs Department of the Washington Office was created in December, 1955, shortly after the merger of the American Federation of Labor and Congress of Industrial Organizations. Its primary concern was to coordinate the Activity of the United Automobile Workers with free trade unions around the world. Victor Reuther directed this department, and Benjamin Seligman worked as his assistant from October, 1956 until August, 1957. In May, 1958, Lewis Carliner took over this responsibility.

The Washington Office opened on February 10, 1943. In its early years, it consisted of several departments which were under the direction of vice-presidents, Richard Frankenstein and Walter Reuther. Shortly after the 1947 convention, at an executive board meeting on November 28, the Washington Office was reorganized. Between 1947 and 1955, the only division of this office was the Legislative Department which was directed by Donald Montgomery. After the International Affairs Department was created, the Washington Office, which was directed by Montgomery, was divided into two sections, legislative and international affairs. When Donald Montgomery died in October, 1957, Victor Reuther was put in charge of the office. In December, 1962 the Washington Office was abolished, and the International Affairs Department became an Independent agency.

Lewis Carliner joined the Education Department of the United Automobile Workers in 1946, where he worked with Victor Reuther. Carliner was editor of Ammunition, a monthly, illustrated manual which helped to instruct shop stewards, committeemen, and other local union officials. He also conducted education programs, and he directed the educational publication, film and radio activities. From 1951-1953, he assisted Victor Reuther with the publication program of the CIO European Office.

Most of the records in this collection are dated 1956-1962. There are a few items dated 1955, most of which are attached to correspondences dated in January, 1956. There are some letters dated January - April 1963 which concern a visit of Walter Reuther to Japan in November, 1962.

When the Washington office was abolished in December, 1962, the International Affairs Department became an independent agency. The records of that department represent a continuation of the material in this collection. For further information, the researcher should check the International Affairs Department Collection. Additional information concerning the activity of Victor Reuther with international trade affairs see the congress of Industrial Organizations - Washington Office collection and other holdings of the Archives.

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Outgoing Correspondence - Victor Reuther, 1956-1962. Copies of letters sent. Most of this correspondence was created by Victor Reuther. Some of the letters were created by Benjamin Seligman who was his assistant from October, 1956 until August, 1957. These letters are indicated by secondary folder entries which, for summary purposes, do not appear on this guide. The records of this series are arranged chronologically

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Correspondence, reports, press releases, speeches, convention proceedings, executive board minutes, financial reports, invitations, drafts, and clippings. These records were created by Victor Reuther, and they relate to his work with private organizations. Particularly well-documented is his activity with political groups, peace organizations, universities, research foundations, and religious organizations, especially Americans for Democratic Action, Methodist Church, National Council of Churches, National Planning Association, and groups supporting the United Nations. There is also a large amount of documentation concerning the American Travel Association, an agency established to arrange inexpensive group travel for trade union members. The records of this series are arranged alphabetically.

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Correspondence, reports, press releases, newsletters, financial reports, agendas, television scripts, and course material. These records were created by Lewis Carliner, and they relate to his work with private organizations. Particularly well-documented is his activity with universities to establish training programs for officials of trade unions in the underdeveloped countries of Africa, Asia, and Latin America. There is a large amount of documentation concerning the international trade union education program of the National Institute of Labor Education and its relationship with the International Cooperation Administration. The records of this series are arranged alphabetically.

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Correspondence, reports, press releases, minutes and transcripts, clippings and published background material. These records were created by Victor Reuther and they relate to his work with the agencies of the Federal Government, the House of Representatives and the Senate. Particularly well-documented is his work with the Agency for International Development and the International Cooperation Administration in the economic assistance programs for the countries of Latin America. There is also a large amount of documentation concerning the attempts by the President's Committee on Equal Employment Opportunity and its predecessor, the President's Committee on Government Contracts, to eliminate racial discrimination in the employment practices of companies which obtained contracts from the federal government. The records of this series are arranged alphabetically. At the end of the series, there is one folder labeled Labor Attacks - Mailing Lists.

## Index to Correspondents

The index includes most, but not all, of the correspondents in this collection who wrote letters of substance. In some cases, where a correspondent wrote only one or two letters of substance, the entries were eliminated. The following persons, who because of their positions as creators of the records in this collection and who are therefore responsible for a preponderant amount of the correspondence, were omitted from this index: Victor Reuther, Lewis Carliner and Benjamin Seligman. Only the names of persons sending the letters are indexed. Some of the correspondence consists of copies of letters sent to third parties. Such letters are indexed, but at all times the names listed refer to the persons who wrote the letters. Some of the correspondence may be drafts of letters written by Victor Reuther or Lewis Carliner and signed by other persons. Many of those letters signed as Walter Reuther are obviously drafts. These letters are included in the index, but the researcher should be aware that such letters may never have been sent or may have been sent in a different form. Because this collection covers a long time period (1956-1962), the dates (year only) of the letters are included. In most cases, the titles of the positions which the correspondents held during the time period of the Collection are noted. The fact that some correspondents, especially those who wrote a large amount of letters, changed their positions or who held more than one position simultaneously, during the time period of this collection is also noted.

The index is arranged alphabetically by surnames of the correspondents. The first number signifies the box number; the number after the colon indicates in which folders the letters are located. The date of the letters is listed in parenthesis. In cases where there are preponderant amounts of correspondence in several folders from the persons listed in the index, the box number is listed after his position so that each entry does not have to be indexed. James Carey, for example, was Secretary-Treasurer of the AFL-CIO Industrial Union Department, and many of his letters are in Box 83 in folders labeled Industrial Union Department. The index points this fact out by listing Box 83 in parenthesis at the end of his position title. He was also President of the International Union of Electrical Workers, and many of his letters are in Box 86 in folders labeled International Union of Electrical Workers so Box 86 is listed in parenthesis at the end of this position title. In a few cases there are many letters of persons in folders listed in the guide under the surname of the individuals. In such cases the box number appears directly after the surname.
