The papers of the Michigan Citizens Lobby were placed in the Archives of Labor and Urban Affairs in June of 1981 by Mr. Tom Leonard and Mr. Joseph Tuchinsky, Co-Directors of the Michigan Citizens Lobby. The papers were opened for research in November of 1985.

The Michigan Citizens Lobby was incorporated in Michigan in 1973 as a non-profit organization. Its announced aim was to give the Michigan consumer and taxpayer a more effective voice in the state legislature. The Michigan Citizens Lobby has involved itself in issues such as utility rates, health and medical care, and sales taxes on food and medicine. It currently maintains offices in Ann Arbor, Lansing, and Southfield.

The papers of the Michigan Citizens Lobby consist of clippings, memoranda, and pamphlets relating to the work of the organization during the years from 1973 to 1981.
