Abstract:	The Prismatic Club, a literary social club, was founded in Detroit in 1867. This collection includes administrative and officers' files, minutes, newsletters and club event documents, as well as members' presentations, publications and biographical forms. There are some photos and graphics, mainly cartoons and sketches by members. Photo negatives and slides of the club's portrait collection and some events are in the Reuther Audiovisual Department.

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History

On January 10, 1867, five Detroit gentlemen, led by Samuel R. Bartlett, met to form the Prismatic Club. Patterned after a Massachusetts literary society, The Social Circle of Concord, the Prismatic Club, still active in 2017, is the oldest club of its kind in Detroit and one of the oldest in the United States. The

men-only club has a cultural, social and literary focus. Members come from a wide range of professions and careers. They have included many prominent Detroiters and Michiganders including elected officials, university presidents, businessmen, attorneys, physicians, artist and architects, clerics, historians and teachers, librarians and archivists. The club also elects selected honorary members from other parts of the country. Members give presentations weekly on a variety of topics, including history, medicine, engineering, genealogy, art, literature and gastronomy--any subjects encouraging the exchange of ideas. The club presents several annual social events, notably a members' annual dinner and a number of programs to which women are invited. Since 1928, the Prismatic Club has had its clubhouse at the former home of member Levi L. Barbour at 80 Eliot Street in Detroit. The club has commissioned portraits of club presidents since 1877 and therefore has one of the best portrait collections of the area's civic, social, business and community leaders. Two books of Prismatic Club history have been published: Prismatic of Detroit: Prismatic Club 1866-1966, by Philip P. Mason and Paul T. Rankin (1970), and Prismatic of Detroit: Prismatic Club 1969-1996 (1997).

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Scope and Content

Series 1: Administrative files, 1867-2007. This series includes officers' files and correspondence, minutes and record books, some legal and financial documents. Series 2: Presentations and speeches by members, 1867-2007. Series 3: Event documents, 1867-2007. Annual dinner invitations and programs, event announcements and ephemera, some correspondence. Series 4: Graphics and photographs, 1867-1981. Club photographs, photographs and photocopies of some presidents' portraits, sketches and cartoons. Series 5: Club and member publications, 1869-2006. Club newsletters, member publications, various documents, some correspondence, one artifact. Various documents, proofs and correspondence re club history books. Series 6: Member biographies and biographical forms, 1867-2006. Note: two boxes in this series are restricted, accessible with Prismatic Club permission. Dates noted on folders correspond to year when the member joined the Prismatic Club. Series 7: Audiovisual materials, 1872-2002. One box of photographic negatives. One box of slides containing images of club presidents' portraits and some club events. One drawer of oversize club books with texts and drawings, and other loose drawings and documents.
