**Abstract:** Nancy Vom Steeg was a Detroit activist during the 1960s through

the 1980s. Though Poletown might have been the more well-known issue of the time, Nancy was a part of several movements, such as food coops, environmentalism, women and religion, and consumer

protection.

### **History**

Nancy Vom Steeg was born in 1935 to Carl and Annetta Wonnberger. Carl was head of the English department at Cranbrook School from 1929 to 1967.

Nancy graduated from Kingswood School in 1953. She studied Art at Michigan State University and later transferred to University of Michigan. In 1963 she married Erich Vom Steeg. They moved to Lafayette Park in 1966.

In the late 1960s Nancy and Erich became further involved with Detroit area political and activist organizations. They held meetings in their Nicolet St. home, with many of their neighbors in attendance. Nancy and her husband participated in the Poor People's Campaign of 1968, and marched in Washington DC, where she was arrested while protesting.

Nancy Vom Steeg was very vocal about the destruction of Poletown for the GM plant's construction. Nancy and her husband took up many causes, including women's rights, food cooperatives, and consumer protection. Faith played an important role in their lives too. Erich was a Lutheran and Nancy was an Episcopalian. They attended Christ Church Detroit for decades where Erich sang in the choir. Nancy also spoke up for women's roles in religion, particularly advocating ion for women to become ministers.
