The papers of Dr. William G. Fredrick, Sc.D. were placed in the University Archives by Mrs. William G. Fredrick in August 1976 and January 1977.

Dr. William G. Fredrick, Sc.D., Chairman of the Wayne State University School of Medicine, Department of Occupational and Environmental Health, and Director of the Detroit Department of Health, was born in Lockland, Ohio on January 25, 1909. After receiving his doctorate at the University of Michigan in 1936, Dr. Fredrick embarked upon a career which spanned 40 years, beginning as a member of a team which helped solve the lead poisoning problem in the auto industry during the 1930's. Upon graduation from the U of M, Dr. Fredrick accepted a position with the Detroit Department of Health, working as chief Chemist for the Bureau of Industrial Hygiene from 1936 until 1945 when he became Director of the Detroit Department of Health, a position he held for 25 years until 1970. In 1947, Dr. Fredrick entered the field of education and became a parttime assistant professor at Wayne State University. Two years later he received a full professorship but continued to divide his time between Wayne State and the Detroit Department of Health until 1970 when he taught full-time at Wayne State and became Chairman of the Wayne State University School of Medicine, Department of Occupational and Environmental Health in 1971. He retained this post until his death in Royal Oak, Michigan on June 27, 1976.

In addition to Dr. Fredrick's work at the Detroit Department of Health and Wayne State University, he also served as President of the Michigan Industrial Hygiene Society, 1948-1949; Chairman of the American Chemical Society, Detroit Section. 1952-1953;. Director, Trustee and member of the National Sanitation Foundation. 1952-1976; President of the American Conference of Governmental Industrial Hygienists, 1957-1958; lecturer in environmental health at the university of Michigan's School of Public Health and consultant to its Institute of Industrial Health, 1957-1960; Director and Secretary of the American Industrial Hygiene Association, 1957-1963; President of the American Academy of Industrial Hygiene, 1968-1970; and President of the American Board of Industrial Hygiene, 1971-1976. The crowning glory of Dr. Fredrick's career came in 1975 when he was appointed by Michigan Governor William Milliken to chair the State's Occupational Health Standards Commission.

The papers in this collection reflect Dr. Fredrick's work as an educator first at the University of Michigan (1957-1960) and later at Wayne State University (1960-1976), and his work in the fields of Air Quality (1952-1958, 1966-1975), Industrial Toxicology (1932-1976), and Industrial Hygiene (1943-1976).
