The papers of the Vice President for Academic Administration, Winfred A. Harbison, were placed in the University Archives in seventeen shipments beginning in March of 1962 and ending in January of 1971. The papers include not only Harbison's files as Vice President but also his files as Associate Dean of Administration. There is also some general and personal correspondence of Harlan Hagman, Dean of Administration.

Winfred A. Harbison was the first Vice President for Academic Administration and served in that position from 1953 through 1970. He came to Wayne as an instructor in History in 1929, was Associate Dean of Administration from 1952-1953 and retired from the University in 1972. For more biographical information see "Winfred A. Harbison -Abridged Biographical Data" on page 13.

The collection reflects Harbison's responsibility for the organization, development, coordination and review of instructional services in the University; the coordination of inter college and University-wide education policies and programs, including the chairmanship of the University Council; administration of student personnel services, admissions and records; and employment and utilization of professional personnel.

# August 12, 1952, excerpt from The Faculty Bulletin of Wayne University

"...Dr. Clarence B. Hilberry, acting president, has announced the following reorganizations and assignments of responsibilities.

Office of the Dean of Administration

On July 21, 1952 a plan of interim organization was announced for the office of the Dean of Administration. The duties of the office are to be shared by three officers, each of whom will be fully responsible, under the Acting President, in his own area. Each of them, however, will work closely with the others who share the overall responsibility of the office. Such constant consultation is imperative since no one aspect of the responsibility of the Dean of Administration is divorced from any other.

Dr. Henry Pixley has been named Associate Dean of Administration with full responsibility in all the areas in which he has been acting, as well as Divisional Director of Admissions, Records, and Registration. Dr. William Borgman will carry, as Associate Dean of Administration, full responsibility, under the Acting President, for all matters of personnel and personnel policy. He will undertake a number of other responsibilities such as general institutional reporting and many of the relations of Wayne University with sister institutions.

Dr. Winfred Harbison will serve on a temporary basis for the coming year as Associate Dean of Administration. He will be responsible for the general academic administration of the office. His responsibilities will include (a) the day by day relations with the University Council (if the chairman [President of Wayne] should be unable to be present, Dr. Harbison will chair the meetings of the Steering Committee and the University Council), (b) the Inter-College Course Committee, (c) the Scholarship Awards Committee which he will chair."

The office of vice president was created at Wayne on August 11,1953. The first four vice presidents were: Arthur Neef (Vice President and Provost), Winfred A. Harbison (Vice President for Academic Administration), Olin E. Thomas (Vice President for Business and Finance) and William E. Stirton (Vice President for University Services and Development).

At the August 11,1953 Detroit Board of Education meeting which created vice presidencies, the Board also replaced the title "Dean of Student Affairs" with "Dean of Students." Harold E. Stewart, Dean of Students, would now report to Vice President Harbison. Lloyd Allen Cook was assigned as Associate Dean of Adminstration to fill the temporary vacancy created through the year's absence of Harbison, who, until his promotion to a Vice President August 11, was Associate Dean of Administration. Harbison received a Fulbright Grant to lecture in history at the University of Aberdeen, Aberdeen, Scotland, in 1953-54.

Professor E. Burrows Smith was assigned as assistant to the Vice President for Academic Administration from January 25,1958 to August 1,1964 when he was named chairman of the Department of Romance and Germanic Languages and Literatures. He chaired the department from 1964 to 1971, was Associate Dean of the College of Liberal Arts in 1971 and served as Associate Provost for Academic Administration from 1972 until his retirement in 1984.

# June 1,1962 description of Vice President for Academic Administration responsibilities:

"The Office is charged with the general responsibility for organization, development, coordination, and review of instructional services in the University. Related to the area of general responsibility are commitments to student personnel services, admissions and records, employment and utilization of professional personnel, and operation of programs and activities outside the jurisdiction of the separate colleges.

Though each college is in large measure autonomous in program development and administration, the implementation of university policy and the overseeing the operation of academic programs are obligations of the Office of the Vice President for Academic Administration. Personnel recommendations with respect to professional employees of the University flow through the Office under the attention of the Associate Dean of Administration and the Vice President. Admissions of students and the keeping of records, the scheduling of classes and classrooms, the provision of information about academic matters are occupations of the Office.

Curriculum development and supervision are wirhin the area of the office though there is necessarily a close working relationship with the Office of the Vice President for Graduate Studies and Research in matters of mutual concern.

The Dean of Students supervises the wide range of student activities, offers to students the many services of counselling, job placement, and financial aid, and oversees the housing of students both on and off campus.

Such discrete operations as the University Center for Adult Education, the University Professorship, radio and television, audio-visual services, libraries, the University Press, physical education and athletics, the Department of Mortuary Science are under the purview of the Vice President for Academic Administration.

Among the most pressing concerns of the Vice President for Academic Administration are the development of policy in academic matters, the analysis and review of existing programs and services, the projection of the University's work into the future."

# July 8,1965 description of Vice President for Academic Administration responsibilities:

"The Vice President for Academic Administration has as his major responsibilities (many are carried out largely through staff officers):

- 1. The encouragement and support of the undergraduate programs of the University. This function is normally fulfilled through the Deans, the budgeting process and the President's office, but the Vice President should meet with each undergraduate college faculty (or faculty council if this is more appropriate) at least once each academic year.
- 2. The coordination of inter-college and university-wide educational programs and policies, including the chairmanship of the University Council, membership on the Council of Deans and special University committees.
- 3. The encouragement and coordination of appropriate non-degree academic programs, such as Adult Education, Mortuary Science and Urban Extension.
- 4. Serving as a staff officer of the President with special attention to instructional, student and academic service areas and developments.
- 5. The coordination and general supervision of the University-wide academic services of the institution, such as undergraduate admissions, libraries and archives, educational technology, radio, etc.
- 6. Vice Presidential level of administration of student services and activities, including intercollegiate athletics, the Student-Faculty Council and The Collegian.
- 7. The interpretation and implementation of the University's academic personnel policies and procedures.
- 8. Appropriate attention to external academic and related responsibilities, such as North Central Association, State Cost Study, community college developments, historical and theological associations, etc."


# 1967-68 description of Vice President for Academic Administration responsibilities:

- "a. The encouragement and suport of the undergraduate progrmas of the University; in this capacity he should confer with each undergraduate faculty (or faculty council if this is more appropriate) at least once a year;
- c. the administration of the general academic services of the University: admissions, records, the libraries, inter-college student services and activities,

d. the interpretation and supervision of University academic personnel policies and procedures."

There are Council minutes for 1939-40 to 1946-47 and minutes of the Steering Committee, the Council's executive body for 1947-1959. Many of the University committee files pertain to personnel matters such as fringe benefits, rights and responsibilities, and salary. Some are for administrative committees such as the President's Staff Committee. There are a few non Wayne committees in the series. Additional material relating to committees may also be found in other series.
- Series VIII: **Events**, 1946-1969; Boxes 139-144

  Mainly University events such as commencement, conferences, programs, lectures and social activities as well as local and national events in which Wayne was invited to participate or support such as the "Great Decisions" series.
- Series IX: **Personnel**, 1944-1949; Boxes 145-165

  Minutes, correspondence and reports on personnel policies and procedures, in particular for academic employees, as well as personnel organizations such as the American Association of University Professors. The series includes sabbatical leaves applications for 1956-57 through 1968-69. There are also personnel files containing employee biographical data and information on departments, colleges and the University.

- Series X: Research, Reports, Studies and Publications, 1944-1969; Boxes 166-169

  The research files relate to research proposed or in progress by Wayne's colleges and/or departments as well as University research policies. The reports, studies and publication files include Wayne and some non Wayne material. Information on the University's catalogs will be found in "Publications."
- Series XI: Students, 1940-1969; Boxes 170-181

  Lists, minutes, reports and correspondence relating to student organizations, student government, fraternities and sororities. Subject files document students as well as student academic life and activities including employment, fees, housing, marking system, non-matriculate students, Reserve Officer Training Corps, and veterans.
- Series XII: **General Subjects and Harlan Hagman**, 1942-1969; Boxes 182-189 The general subject files include topics such as academic calendars, courses, outside speaker policies, smoking and travel tours. The Hagman subseries (1958-1969) consists of general and personal correspondence in addition to meetings and speeches correspondence.
- Series XIII: Associations and Organizations, 1932,1945-1969; Boxes 190-221 Correspondence, reports, financial data, and minutes of higher education professional associations and organizations. The files reflect Wayne's relationship and involvement with these groups. The subjects covered generally involve those affecting academia such as accreditation, athletics, cost, faculty and non academic personnel, legislation, scholarships, and student affairs.
- Series XIV: Government and Business and Industry, 1946-1969; Boxes 222-231 The "Government" subseries consists of international, federal, Michigan, other states, Wayne County, and Detroit files. The subseries includes material relating to legislation, College Work-Study Program for 1964-65, and the National Defense Education Act for the period 1958-1965. There is information on a variety of scholarships and student financial aids in the "Business and Industry" subseries.
- Series XV: Non Wayne Colleges and Universities, 1947-1969; Boxes 232-240 The files contain survey requests and results; requests and answers for information on Wayne's programs, departments, faculty governance, and policies and procedures on a variety of topics; and information on non Wayne colleges and universities. # February 20,1970, excerpt from WSU press release

"In following Vice President Harbison in the University's senior academic administrative position," Keast [President William R. Keast] said, "Dean Cambel [AH B. Cambel] succeeds a man to whom Wayne State University owes an incalculable debt. 'Gence' Harbison joined the Wayne faculty in 1929 as an instructor in history. He has served-always with distinction—as professor and chairman of his own department, as associate dean for administration, and since 1953 as vice president. He has been the academic conscience of the University and its administration; the University's steady rise is in large measure attributable to his high standards, his devotion to the University, and to the universal esteem in which he is held by his colleagues. During the five years of my presidency, I have relied in all critical decisions upon his wisdom and experience."

#### May 5,1970, excerpt from Board of Governors Resolution

"Gence (a nickname with a long history) first undertook a University administrative assignment in 1952 as Associate Dean of Administration at the request of the late President Clarence Hilberry. Since that time, he has served on and chaired more committees, commissions, and meetings than any other faculty member or administrator. He has worked in every conceivable area of concern to Wayne State University-from admissions policy to graduation, from Athletics to the Wayne State Fund, from the Law School to Zoology. Only in 1953-1954, a year in which he spent at the University of Aberdeen, Scotland, as Fulbright lecturer in History, did he momentarily put aside his University burdens.

His conduct of his office with integrity and balanced judgment, his understanding of academic procedures, his efforts to find acceptable solutions to problems rather than to surrender to lesser answers, his gentlemanly leadership, and his steadfast good nature have gained him respect, trust, and rapport with the faculty and officers of the University, soothed many ruffled feathers, and been instrumental in bringing about the transformation of a relatively small, municipal college into a complex, major state university."

# July 12,1970, excerpt from Detroit News

"It's trite to say "goodby Mr. Chips" but it is an apt farewell -- if only temporary --to Dr. Winfred A. Harbison who is leaving Wayne State University after 41 years.

He is the last of the "Old Guard," the administrator who served under Dr. David D. Henry and Dr. Clarence Hilberry in the important years when Wayne made the transition from a city collee to a major state university.

Harbison was the first vice-president for academic administration appointed at Wayne and has been the chief academic officer since 1953.

A tall and gentle man, Harbison has a family nickname of "Gence" - which everyone naturally assumed was "Gents"  $\sim$  because it fitted him so perfectly.

Harbison has been the quiet counselor, the voice of reason, the buffer between the top administration and the faculty.

He was a professor of history in 1952 when the late Dr. Hilberry asked him to "help out" in an administrative post.

"I thought he meant just for a few months," Dr. Harbison said, "but it turned out to be 18 years."

He did not actually start his administrative duties unitl a year later because he had an appointment as Fulbright lecturer in history at Scotland's University of Aberdeen in the 1953-54 academic year.

"I've enjoyed being in administration," Dr. Harbison said. "It's interesting to be close to where the decisions are made."

It replaced this practice in the early to mid 1960s with broad headings. The researcher should consult the specific subject file as well as the space and alterations committee and general space and alterations files. Adittional material on buildings is scattered throughout the collection, in particular in Series I and Series VI.

# Subseries A: Colleges, Schools and Divisions, 1937,1941,1945-1969; Boxes 35-77

Constitutions, correspondence, memos, minutes, reports, clippings, and financial data relating to Wayne's academic colleges, schools, and divisions. The subseries contains excellent material documenting the growth, development, activities and organizational changes of the University's departments, colleges and schools. The subjects within the college files include committees, deanship selection, policies, personnel, and policy formulating bodies such as the Graduate Academic Council. In addition to these subjects, files on athletics will also be found under the Health and Physical Education Division. The researcher should also consult Subseries B for additional academic departments and units.

Files are in alphabetical order by college, school or division. Within each college, etc., material is organized in the following manner: general memos and correspondence; college wide subjects such as budget and deanship; and departments. All material within folders is filed chronologically.

# Subseries B: Other Units, 1941,1946-1969; Boxes 78-112

Records relating to non-academic divisions, units and offices as well as inter college and University wide programs, and academic departments and units which had been transferred to several colleges or whose college affiliation was unclear. The files include the University Libraries, special projects, and proposed colleges such as the Creative Arts College. The files are in alphabetical order and material within folders is filed chronologically.

Note for Subseries A and Subseries B: The Office for Vice President for Academic Administration originally assigned very specific and detailed folder headings for its files. It discontinued this practice in the early to mid 1960s. The researcher should consult both the specific subject file as well as the general files at the beginning of each college, etc.

# Series VII University Council and Committees, 1939-1969 Boxes 113-138

This series is divided into the following two sub-series:

Subseries A: University Council, 1939-1969; Boxes 113-Box 123 (folders 1-18) The subseries includes minutes, correspondence, memos and reports of the Council and its committees. Of particular importance are the Council minutes for 1939-40 to 1946-47 and the minutes for 1947-1959 of the Steering Committee, the Council's executive body. Harbison chaired the University Council from 1954 to 1970. The files are arranged in alphabetical order and material within folders is filed chronologically. See the note below for the functions and responsibilities of the University Council.

Subseries B: Committees, 1946-1969; Box 123 (folders 19-31) to Box 138

The files are arranged in alphabetical order by committee. With the exception of several committees, all are University committees. Many of the committees relate to personnel matters such as fringe benefits, rights and responsibilities, and salary. Others are administrative committees such as the Administrative Conference, President-Deans Conference, and President's Staff Committee. Material pertaining to committees may also be found in other series. In Series VIII (Events), for example, there is material on commencement and the Franklin Lectures committees.

# From the Statutes and By-Laws of Wayne University, September 1947

The University Council shall have general legistative authority over all matters concerning the University as a whole, but not over the internal affairs of a college, except where the same affect the interests of the University as a whole or the interests of other colleges. Questions of jurisdiction as between the University Council and a College shall be decided by the President.

## From the Statutes of Wayne State University, November 15,1961

The University Council is the instrumentality by which the faculties of the University can express to the President of the University and the Board of Governors their considered opinion and judgments upon matters of educational policy affecting the University community. Although the privilege of direct communication by any member of the faculty is affirmed, this Council is recognized as the official and major channel of communication on such matters between the faculties and this Board...

This Council has authority and responsibility for the formulation and review of educational policy affecting the University as a whole; but this responsibility shall extend to the internal affairs of colleges, schools, divisions and other units of the University only where they significantly affect the interests of other units or the University as a whole.

The University Council shall, in particular, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, recommend to the President and the Board of Governors policies affecting faculty rights and responsibilities, faculty welfare, and generally accepted principles of academic freedom and tenure.

In case of appointments to administrative posts above the level of deanships the Council may offer recommendations as to criteria and may provide for systematic faculty consultation in regard to particular appointments...

The President will be expected to secure the judgment of the Council upon any proposed change in educational policy or any matter affecting faculty rights and responsibilities before taking formal action thereon unless he deems the matter too urgent to permit delay. In the latter case he shall promptly report the action taken to the Council for its review.

# Subseries A: Subject Files 1944-1969; Boxes 145-159

Harbison was responsibile for the interpretation and implementation of the University's academic personnel policies and procedures. Subseries A and B reflect this responsibility. Subseries A consists of subject files arranged alphabetically by topic. There are minutes, correspondence and reports relating to subjects such as classification plans, insurance, retirement, personnel organizations such as the American Association of University Professors, policies and procedures, non-academic personnel, and sabbatical leaves. The sabbatical leaves files include applications for 1956-57 through 1968-69. Applications generally contain considerable biographical information. The subseries also includes employment letters sent to Wayne from 1949-1969. The letters are located in boxes 158 and 159 after the subject files.

## Subseries B: Personnel Files; Boxes 160-165

The personnel files should be examined not only for employee biographical data, in particular faculty, but also for information on departments, colleges and the University. Because of his position, Harbison had many files relating to personnel decisions. The personnel files were sampled and then weeded of routine items and forms. The files in boxes 160-163 were selected because: 1) the employee made significant contributions to Wayne, was well known and/or was strongly identified with Wayne because of longevity; 2) the records document Wayne's personnel policies and procedures; and/or 3) the records document departmental, college or University growth, direction and activities. The files are arranged in alphabetical order by surname. Whenever it was known, the employee's department or college is on the folder heading.

The personnel files in boxes 164 and 165 are closed for research. They contain very sensitive and confidential personnel material and may only be used with the authorization of the University Archivist or his/her designee.
